



Health of the Globe (Global Health)

- 1. We are surrounded by a lot of empty space
- 2. Our "natural resources" are fixed (and therefore finite)
- 3. We have been preceded by other life forms (that have died off)
- 4. We will likely be followed by other life forms (when we die off)
- 5. Longevity of food chains depend on reduction/elimination of unnecessary waste.
- 6. How we interact with each other (all other carbon based life) will determine our ability to extend our "stationary" population

The Feedback Loop

•(G)overnments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed; that whenever any form of government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new government, laying its foundation on such principles, and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness.



The second is freedom of every person to worship God in his own way -- everywhere in the world




The third is freedom from want, which, translated into world terms, means economic understandings which will secure to every nation a healthy peacetime life for its inhabitants -- everywhere in the world.


Cold War ~ Continual Wartime Footing



"Letter to the American people"

- The blood pouring out of Palestine must be equally revenged.
- You attacked us in Somalia; you supported the Russian atrocities against us in Chechnya, the Indian oppression against us in Kashmir, and the Jewish aggression against us in Lebanon.
- You steal our wealth and oil at paltry prices because of your international influence and military threats.
- Your forces occupy our countries; you spread your military bases throughout them
- You have starved the Muslims of Iraq, where children die every day. It is a wonder that more than 1.5 million Iraqi children have died as a result of your sanctions, and you did not show concern.

Why are we fighting and opposing you?

- The American people have the ability and choice to refuse the policies of their Government and even to change it if they want.
- The American people are the ones who pay the taxes which fund the planes that bomb us in Afghanistan, the tanks that strike and destroy our homes in Palestine, the armies which occupy our lands in the Arabian Gulf, and the fleets which ensure the blockade of Iraq.
- This is why the American people cannot be not innocent of all the crimes committed by the Americans and Jews against us.






Wartime Standard of Care

 To the fullest extent of the means available to it, the Occupying Power has the duty of ensuring and maintaining, with the cooperation of national and local authorities, the medical and hospital establishments and services, public health and hygiene in the occupied territory, with particular reference to the adoption and application of the prophylactic and preventive measures necessary to combat the spread of contagious diseases and epidemics.

DoD Instruction 6000.16

 Military Health System shall be prepared to perform any tasks to assigned to establish, reconstitute and maintain air and reconstitute health sector capacity and capability for the indigenous population when indigenous, foreign or U.S. civilian professionals cannot do so.





2007 Global Poverty Act

To require the President to develop and implement a comprehensive strategy to further the United States foreign policy objective of promoting the reduction of global poverty, the elimination of extreme global poverty, and the achievement of the Millennium Development Goal of reducing by one-half the proportion of people worldwide, between 1990 and 2015, who live on less than \$1 per day.
